Principal's Report

This next section applies to only a small number of parents in our school community, but unfortunately it has again become necessary for me to reiterate information I have previously communicated.

There is not a single child in our school who is old enough to be using TikTok or Snapchat or any other adult oriented application. Unfortunately, we see the issues which arise when parents allow their children to use these apps. We are aware of incidences of nude and suggestive images, bullying, aggressive and threatening posts and the distribution of other inappropriate content online. This exposure can only occur if you allow your child to use these apps. If you do not want your child to be exposed to this content, don't let them use the apps. Check their phone, remove the apps, talk with them about the dangers of being online.

It is not the school's responsibility to manage online issues which occur because of decisions you have made as a parent.

If you need to report inappropriate content or communications, you can do so using your name and contact information, or anonymously. Depending on what the content is, choose the appropriate avenue to report:

Contact the application directly and ask for content to be removed.


Parent Reminder Student Allergies


