Principal's Report

Another quiet week around the school. Classes are settled and there is a continued focus on teaching and learning. Our thoughts are with all those communities affected by the floods. There are a number of schools in our network directly impacted and we are offering whatever support we can to them.

We are slowly seeing some of the infrastructure work around school being started. There are significant delays not just to our own work, but around the state as a result of supply chain issues and now the widespread flooding. New fixed equipment, shade shelters and electronic sign are all still coming.

Students have been reminded again this week of the expectation that they must walk their bikes and scooters through the front gate. Both feet on the ground walking before they come through the black gates. This is to ensure the safety of those inside the school, particularly our youngest students and infant siblings, vision of whom is blocked by the bricks. The reverse applies in the afternoon when leaving school, students must walk their bikes and scooters out the gate before riding. Consequence for not meeting this expectation is that the student will be unable to bring their bike or scooter onto school grounds for a period of time.

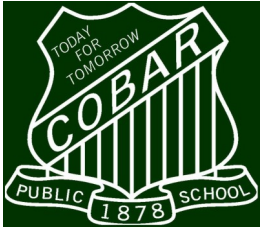

Why wear a uniform?



At Cobar Public School we want to empower our students to be confident and succeed, by developing their sense of belonging, and pride in themselves, their school and community, by wearing their school uniform each day.

WE SHOW RESPECT BY WEARING UNIFORM

By wearing school uniforms students show they respect themselves and are proud to belong to their school and community. They grow a sense of connection and a greater understanding of their place in their community.

School uniforms also encourage inclusion and all students to feel a sense of belonging and connection to their school, and community, regardless of their background, or beliefs.

WE TAKE RESPONSIBILITY BY WEARING UNIFORM

School uniforms prepare children for formal scenarios that we all encounter in our lives. Dressing professionally and appropriately in working environments is expected in adulthood, and this is something your child will understand thanks to a school uniform.

Wearing a uniform also helps to build a child's sense of personal responsibility and pride in who they are, and what they value as a person.

They grow their sense of independence. In the daily rush of getting students to school, having a uniform means students know what to wear, and it is one less thing that parents need to manage.

WE ARE ENGAGED IN LEARNING WEARING UNIFORM

Uniforms make for one less distraction during school. By wearing what they like, not their school uniform, students can become more focused on their school status rather than their studies.

School uniforms positively contribute to a child's behaviour in school. When they wear their uniform they develop an affinity with learning. Once they put it on, their purpose is to work hard at their learning.
