Principal's Report

Welcome back to Term 3 2021. With COVID restrictions on travel in place it seems it was a quieter holiday for many in our community. Yesterday at 11.00am the Premier announced an extension of COVID restrictions and the Secretary of Education communicated with all schools that the heightened restrictions will remain for the foreseeable future

Restrictions have heightened to again restrict non-essential entry to site as well as non-essential activities. We will continue with fortnightly assemblies, sports and other internal events however these return to a no spectator/visitor level of COVID restrictions. When the school takes students to an offsite venue, that venue becomes a defacto school site and the same COVID restrictions as would apply at the school also apply to that venue. We thank you for your understanding with this.

Thank you to everyone for your understanding with the new drop off and pick-up restrictions. Yr3-6 will continue to use the green gate, K-2 the large black gate and Ngalii the smaller gate to the east of the black gate.

We will continue with our internal hygiene protocols with all staff and students cleaning their hands at point of entry, then regular hand washing throughout the day. Increased cleaning of classrooms and other areas continues.

We welcome Mrs. Sharp to our school community as the new classroom teacher on 3/4S.

Unfortunately, due to the COVID, StormCo was forced to postpone their planned visit during the holidays. I am working with StormCo to enable a visit during the Term 3 holidays, COVID allowing.

Some significant infrastructure work was undertaken during the holidays, with the eastern staff car-park being resurfaced and the final stretch of fence and new gate being installed. Some months ago, during the annual tree inspection, the arborist identified 2 dangerous trees, a pair of large, leaning, old gum trees on the edge of the carpark. Due to their condition these had to be removed.

Good luck to our team playing in the PSSA league in Dubbo next Tuesday.

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 
